

Join us for Coffee Fellowship on the North Lawn, weather permitting, or the Morrow Room to meet one another, say hello to new faces, and enjoy refreshments.




CALL TO CONFESSION

Join us today at 12:30 p.m. for Divesting for the Individual presented by Rev. Sue Smith in the Esther Morrow Room, preceded by a light lunch. The Rev. Sue Smith, co-chaired the Advisory Committee on Social Witness Policy, and co-authored Investing in a Green Future: A Vision for a Renewed Creation, which commissioners approved by a vote of 325-27. Among other things, the study directs the Presbyterian Committee on Mission Responsibility Through Responsibility to engage with insurance companies and banks to cease insuring or lending to new fossil fuel projects. Sue works for God's creation in both religious and secular organizations: from representing GreenFaith on the Coalition for Healthy Ports, to board membership with Clean Water Action's NJ chapter, to serving as Vice Moderator of Presbyterians for Earth Care. Sue holds a BA from Cornell University, an MBA from NYU, is a former financial advisor, is an M.Div. graduate of New Brunswick Theological Seminary, and has served as Moderator of Monmouth Presbytery.
