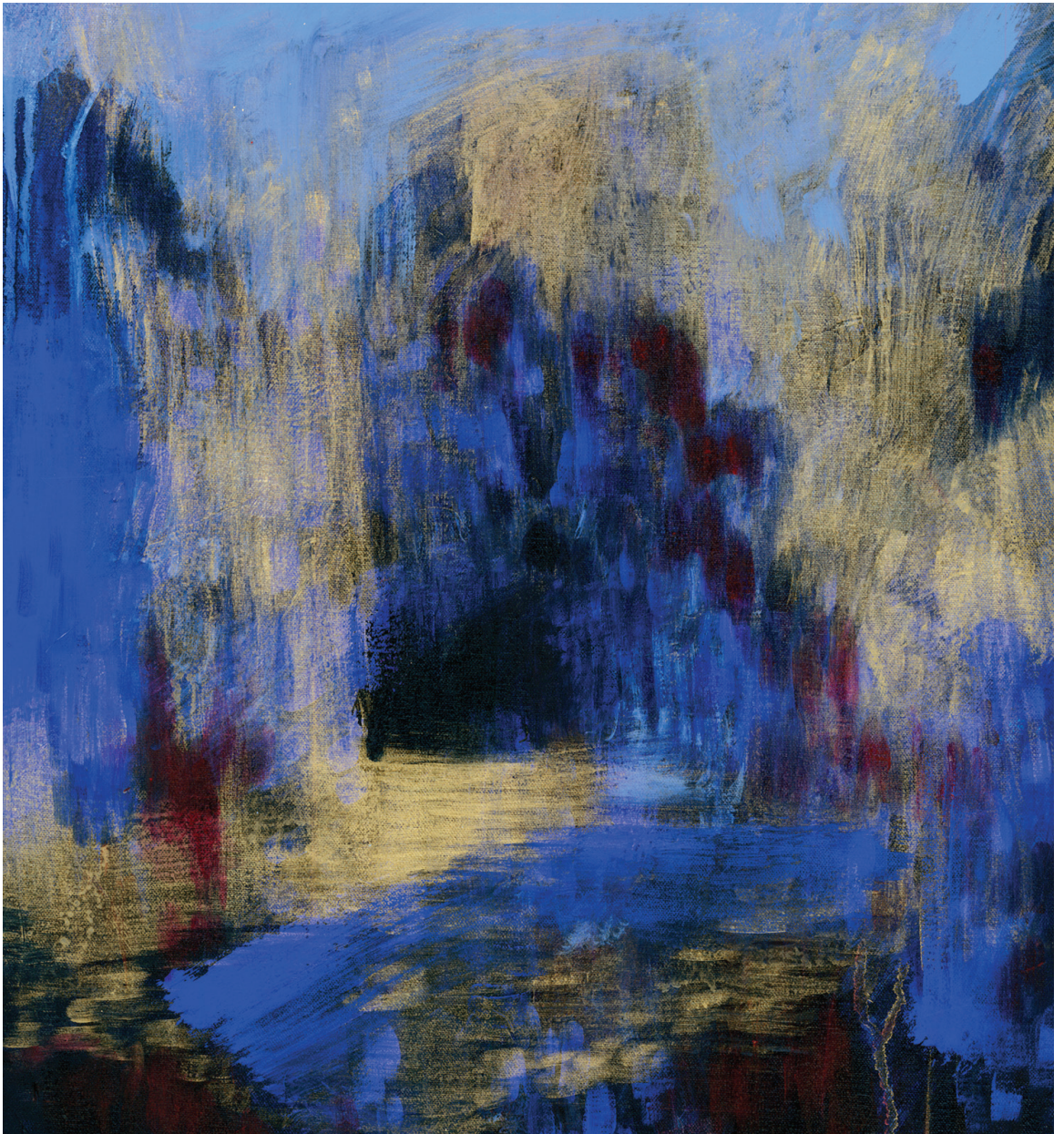

which can open new possibilities of life for society and the world.**



**MUSIC NOTE** Lucy Walker (b. 1998) is an award-winning composer, pianist and music educator currently based in Cambridge. She is included among Classic FM's 2024 list of young musicians reshaping classical music. *Today*, composed in 2021, sets words of Nigerian poet Ozioma Ogbaji to music, in a brief, yet inspiring anthem of hope and strength. *O Clap Your Hands*, based on familiar words from Psalm 47, was commissioned in celebration and honor of Myrle Wall, by Duane Wall, for the Choir of The First Presbyterian Church in the City of New York in 2021. The composer, Philip William John Stopford (b. 1977), began his musical career as a chorister at Westminster Abbey, studied music at Keble College, Oxford, and served on the music staff of several cathedrals before his appointment in 2016 to Christ Church, Bronxville, New York. Recordings of his music can be found across YouTube, Spotify, Amazon, and Apple Music. He was part of the Classic FM Hall of Fame in 2013, 2014 and 2015.
